CRISIS RESPONSE MEDICAL MISSION



SGA (UK)'s ministry has developed from small beginnings to its wide-ranging involvement today in Eastern Europe, Central Asia and Far East Russia. **Thousands have heard the Gospel** through SGA supported missionaries, camps, radio broadcasts, and literature

projects. Transport projects have helped extend the ministry of evangelists. Many Houses of Prayer and church buildings have been erected or refurbished with SGA support. **God has protected staff members** and used them to encourage, instruct, and bless indigenous Gospel workers.

EASTERN EUROPE HUNGARY

EASTERN EUROPE BULGARIA



With a population of around 10 million, less than 3% are evangelical believers. The majority population professes to be Roman Catholic, but there is much nominalism, and everincreasing materialism. In many places there is still resistance

to the Gospel. Praise God that evangelical churches are active in evangelism and in church planting. SGA has been effectively supporting and encouraging this through its Leadership Training programme.

Evangelical believers make up less than 2% of this strongly Orthodox country. Over 2,000 small towns and villages have no Gospel church or established witness. Many, in rural areas particularly, equate citizenship of Bulgaria with adherence to the Orthodox Church. Leadership

Training, Leadership Support, literature projects including funding of a Bulgarian translation of the Bible, and humanitarian aid, particularly through the Widows' Project are among the ways in which SGA supports Gospel ministry in this land.

Pray for those planning and developing new Church planting initiatives throughout the Hungarian speaking population of Central & Eastern Europe.

EASTERN EUROPE SERBIA

EASTERN EUROPE POLAND



As in neighbouring Bulgaria, there is a strong strain of nationalism in this country whereby one's citizenship is defined by one's religion. The Orthodox Church holds sway for the vast majority, and although there is much nominalism, there is also serious opposition to Gospel witness. Almost one quarter of the population lives in

or near the capital, Belgrade, a city with acute social and economic needs. SGA partners with **Bread of Life** in its Gospel care programmes, provides help through the **Widows' Project**, supports ministry through **Leadership Support**, and has **funded the translation of important Christian books**.

Materially more prosperous than many Eastern European countries, Poland continues to be spiritually impoverished.

The vast majority of its 2,500 'gminas' (municipalities) have no evangelical church. SGA's contribution in past decades was largely support for camp ministry

which was blessed of God and the means of bringing many young people to Christ. Today Polish leaders carry on this ministry. SGA continues to support this work financially, but also trains and supports leaders, and provides finance for the invaluable radio ministry, 'Voice of the Gospel'.

EASTERN EUROPE MACEDONIA

BIBLICAL LITERATURE



Part of the former country of Yugoslavia, Macedonia remains one of the most evangelically impoverished nations of Eastern Europe with an estimated total of around 3,000 believers in a predominantly Orthodox population. Though small, the evangelical community is active

and reaches across potentially divisive ethnic boundaries to share the Gospel with all. The small nation is surrounded by countries from which it feels somewhat isolated and threatened. Greece has its own internal region of Macedonia and continues to dispute the country's claim to this name

The pen 'mightier than the sword' continues to be true in Gospel work across our world. From its beginnings SGA(UK) recognized the powerful role of sound Biblical literature, both for the work of evangelism and for the strengthening of believers. The translation of carefully selected

books has been the target of substantial financial input, and has been blessed by God in the maturity of many. Ivan Grozdanov (Macedonia) and Ben Faragau (Romania) have been supported in their 'in-country' writing of books and commentaries

EASTERN EUROPE ROMANIA

ADVANCE IN ROMANIA



The dramatic collapse of the Communist regime in 1989 brought unprecedented opportunities for believers in the former 'underground' churches to expand and intensify their witness to their fellow citizens. The results were both thrilling and deeply challenging, for many

new churches were planted, but were without trained ministry and leadership. SGA had been involved in the secret training of leaders from the 1970s and has provided valuable training for hundreds of evangelists, pastors, children's and youth workers. The range and variety of SGA's contribution to Gospel work in Romania is arguably broader than in any other field of its operation.

The training and support of

Christian workers continues steadily, along with significant help offered for ministry to widows and orphans, the translation and production of Christian literature, Christian radio, transport needs, and the vital work of Emanuel Christian University in Oradea. Many regions of Romania are still without a strong, stable Gospel witness, and SGA continues

where possible to offer Leadership

HOUSES OF PRAYER

GOSPEL ON THE MOVE TRANSPORT



The provision of a place of worship is often critical for the work of evangelism and church planting in Orthodox countries such as Moldova, Serbia and Romania. Orthodox adherents have an inflated view of the Church's structures and furnishings, and are opposed to any idea of

worshipping in a building used for other purposes. The need for a dedicated meeting place, a 'House of Prayer' is therefore critical and essential to the ministry of church planting.

SGA's Houses of Prayer project endeavours to address that need.

Christian workers face constant problems as they attempt to sustain ministry in scattered locations or advance into new areas. Road and transport systems are often poor or even non-existent. Those who own and run vehicles are faced with recurring repair bills, as the roads take their

toll on wheels, tyres, suspension units and so on. SGA's supply of motor bikes to some and good second-hand cars to others, have been a rich practical blessing and help to pastors and evangelists in their spiritual ministry. Gospel work has been significantly enhanced through this project.

Pray for the effective witness of each fellowship that meets in a 'House of Prayer'. Pray that the light of the Gospel will shine forth into their communities.

EASTERN EUROPE UKRAINE

COMPASSION FOR UKRAINE



The history of Ukraine is one of almost continuous subjugation to other powers such as the Vikings, Mongols, Poles, and Russians. The vast region of Ukraine has only become a fully independent nation with the fall of the Soviet Union in 1991, although the spectre of a hostile Russia

continues to throw a dark shadow particularly in the continuing struggle in the east of the country. The majority religion is Orthodox with a large Catholic community too, but there is a small rich vein of evangelical church life, with an emphasis on evangelism and church planting.

Following the annexation of Crimea by Russia in March 2014 serious agitation by pro-Russian sympathizers in the east of the country quickly degenerated into open warfare. The UN reports in excess of 13,000 dead and over 1 million displaced people. Evangelical churches were perceived to be 'western' in

sympathy and were the target of violent action. Many believers fled, but some have remained and in the face of grave danger, continue to care for souls.

SGA has responded by offering financial support to the churches

Pray for the Ukrainian missionary movement as believers seek to bring the Gospel to their people as well as other former Soviet states.

EASTERN EUROPE MODLOVA

ADVANCE IN MOLDOVA



Moldova is one of the poorest countries in which SGA ministers, with many living on the poverty line. SGA's long involvement in Gospel work in Moldova has resulted in a wide range of projects and activities, including the Widows' Project and other humanitarian aid initiatives.

The support of Gospel workers, financially and practically, has been essential to the sustained multiplication of evangelical churches. In the year 1993 there was a Gospel church for every 15 villages; today it is estimated that there is one for every 4 villages.

The SGA Mission school in Balti has been operating for over twenty-five years, and several hundred graduates now serve in the churches in various ministries. The period of intense spiritual renewal following the collapse of Communism, has diminished significantly but, with the support

of SGA, church planting initiatives continue to be undertaken, and Houses of Prayer refurbished or constructed to aid these. Transport is provided for many pastors and evangelists who serve in multiple locations, and mini-libraries given to help Christian workers develop and sustain their ministries

Pray for churches as they deal with the constant emigration of their young people to western countries. This is a common problem across eastern Europe.

CENTRAL ASIA TURKMENISTAN

CENTRAL ASIA UZBEKISTAN





To the south, Turkmenistan borders Iran and Afghanistan, so at once it is clear that Turkmen believers face immense challenges in seeking to live and witness for their Saviour.

Evangelicals are numbered at a few thousand in a population of over 5 million, and many of

these are not ethnic Turkmens, but of Russian and Ukrainian stock. However, in recent years, despite unrelenting opposition and persecution, ethnic Turkmen believers are growing in number and witnessing to their own people.

A 'closed' country to the Gospel after the fall of Communism,

it is encouraging to hear of a recent softening on the part of the government to the outside world. However, this will take time to filter down and ease pressure on believers in this country.

Fyangelical believers number.

Evangelical believers number less than 0.5% in a population

of almost 30 million – an infinitesimal minority. The vast majority in this strongly Muslim country have never met a true believer in Christ. SGA, with Bibel-Mission, supports outreach into this country by radio, literature, and humanitarian aid projects, and the IBCS training course.

Pray for Christians as they seek to live for Christ in one of the most difficult countries to be a believer.

CRISIS RESPONSE ORPHANS & WIDOWS

MISSION WITHOUT WALLS RADIO MINISTRY



'Pure religion' we are told by James, is to care for the fatherless and widows in their need. We are so conscious that this resonates with SGA supporters. The Widows' Project and the various children's projects undertaken have never failed to draw the prayerful and practical support of our partners. More recently the building and maintenance of Hope Centres in Central Asia has been the focus of much SGA prayer and financial aid, initiatives which have resulted in physical, material, and most importantly, spiritual blessings for many.

The title given to SGA's radio support project, 'Mission Without Walls', is appropriate and descriptive of the power and influence of this vital ministry.

The 'voice' of the radio can enable those in circumstances of suppression and persecution to feed on God's Word. It is a

source of encouragement as it reminds them that they belong to a larger family of God. Radio outreach was one of the earliest channels of outreach by SGA, and it continues today in Poland, Romania. and Central Asia.

CENTRAL ASIA KYRGYZSTAN

CENTRAL ASIA TAJIKISTAN



Squeezed between Kazakhstan and China, Kyrgyzstan's six million inhabitants are predominantly Muslim, with a tiny proportion of less than 1% evangelical believers. As in other Central Asian countries Islamic worship is often superficial and syncretistic, with shamanism and occultic

practices still widespread especially in rural communities. There are continuing reports of violent action against believers, especially those who have been converted to Christ from Islam. Yet believers continue to witness, and the churches continue to grow.

A rugged and beautiful country of Central Asia, **Tajikistan remains one of the most spiritually needy regions of the former Soviet Union.** Large areas of the country lack any Gospel church or witness. **There is need of a Tajik translation of the Scriptures.** SGA, in partnership with Bibel Mission, is helping to establish 'Hope Centres' - places of Gospel witness, which also provide help and humanitarian aid to vulnerable adults and children. Support is also provided for church planters through the 70th Anniversary project.

Pray for the small church to mature in faith and be blessed by God as they witness to the truth and uniqueness of Jesus Christ.

BIBLICAL LEADERSHIP TRAINING

BIBLICAL LEADERSHIP TRAINING – IBCS



After the collapse of the Soviet Union the greatest need of the evangelical churches was for trained church leaders. 'Ad hoc' teaching which had been conducted secretly in the forests and mountains of Romania during Soviet times, was developed into a 'School of the Prophets', and

after 1989 into SGA's structured Leadership Training Programme which is in operation today. By request it was 'exported' to other countries, and has helped prepare thousands of Gospel workers across our fields of operation.

The Independent Bible
Correspondence School is
organized by SGA's Central
Asian partners, Bibel Mission,
in Almaty, Kazakhstan. Courses
in nine languages are sent to
students scattered through the
five Muslim countries of Central
Asia, providing teaching for

FAR EAST RUSSIA

CENTRAL ASIA KAZAKHSTAN



It is difficult to convey the geographical isolation of this vast region. It is one of the most sparsely populated parts of the world with less than one person per square kilometre.

Average winter temperatures are below - 35. The absence of any kind of infrastructure in many

regions, coupled with lack of the usual means of communication, and the complexity of ethnic divisions, makes this an extremely difficult and challenging area to evangelize. Russian Orthodoxy is the official religion, but many practise shamanism and folk religion.

The largest land-locked country in the world has a population of less than 18 million, most of whom live around the periphery of the country. Enormous natural reserves have made a minority of the population very rich but left many in poverty. The majority population is Muslim,

but this is often syncretized with shamanism and forms of folk religion. Recent legislation, passed in order to counter Muslim radicalism, has had spin-off effects on Gospel ministry, but the country remains relatively open.

PRAYER POINT

Pray for God's blessing on new evangelists and church planters who are bringing the Gospel to an effectively unreached part of the world.

SPECIFIC LITERATURE KAZAKH BIBLE

CRISIS RESPONSE GENERAL



There are eleven million Kazakh speakers in the country, but until 2010 there was no complete Bible in Kazakh. Only a limited number of this edition was produced, and it was a less than satisfactory translation in some respects. SGA in partnership with

Bibel-Mission has sponsored a new, faithful translation. 100,000 copies will be produced and placed in Kazakh 'extended family' homes with the potential of reaching up to 1 million Kazakh speakers.

From its inception SGA(UK) endeavoured to minister to the 'whole man'. Much of its early ministry was offering humanitarian help. However, in the conviction that 'faith comes by hearing and hearing by the Word of God', SGA's Crisis Response is Bible

based and Gospel orientated.

The various regular aid projects, as well as intervention in emergency and war situations, have provided invaluable opportunities to share the Gospel of the Lord Jesus.

PRAYER POINT

Pray for the conversion of many Muslims to Jesus Christ as the Bible is distributed among the Kazakh people.
